Year after year, defeat after defeat, the Dirty Thirties tested the strength of the family.




The Black Blizzard


more commonly known as the

was a weather phenomenon that occurred from 1930-1940.















students... possible scenarios that people had to deal with who migrated to new places to help their families survive! Adults and children alike had to deal with "bullying" in their desperate fight to survive!



Types of Abuse

Physical Abuse: hitting, kicking, punching


Verbal Abuse: name calling, jokes or offensive remarks



From many, many plants It's "water vapor" if you care!




One corn plant

DEFINITION

an exaggeration used to make or prove a point

EXAMPLE

She was so hungry could eat a horse, but it wasn't her day to eat.

PERSONIFICATION

DEFINITION

giving human characteristics to inanimate things

EXAMPLE

The wind was angry as it screamed down the plains, mocking the once calm day.

figurative

IDIOM

DEFINITION

a word or phrase that means something different than what's said

EXAMPLE


It was only a light rain, but we acted like it was raining cats and dogs




